### **New Solar Panels for FPC & the Care of Gods Creation!**

As some of you have heard, the Resource Committee has been pursuing the addition of solar panels for our Fellowship Hall and CE Building. We successfully obtained a grant last fall from NorthWestern Energy which covers 40% of the overall cost. In addition, we're pursuing other tax credits and donations which we hope will cover the majority of the remaining cost. This new solar array will provide no-cost power for decades to come. The installation consists of fifty-two American-made panels providing 62 kilowatts of power output. This is the maximum size of solar array allowed in the state and will save us around \$8,700 per year in utility bills. The installation of the solar panels will start this Monday and will continue for several weeks. Staging will mostly occur in the school's parking off of the alley. During this time, we'll allow teachers to park in our church lot during the day. Other than that, we don't foresee any major impacts for our church activities. Once the solar installation is complete, we'll put out another announcement.
